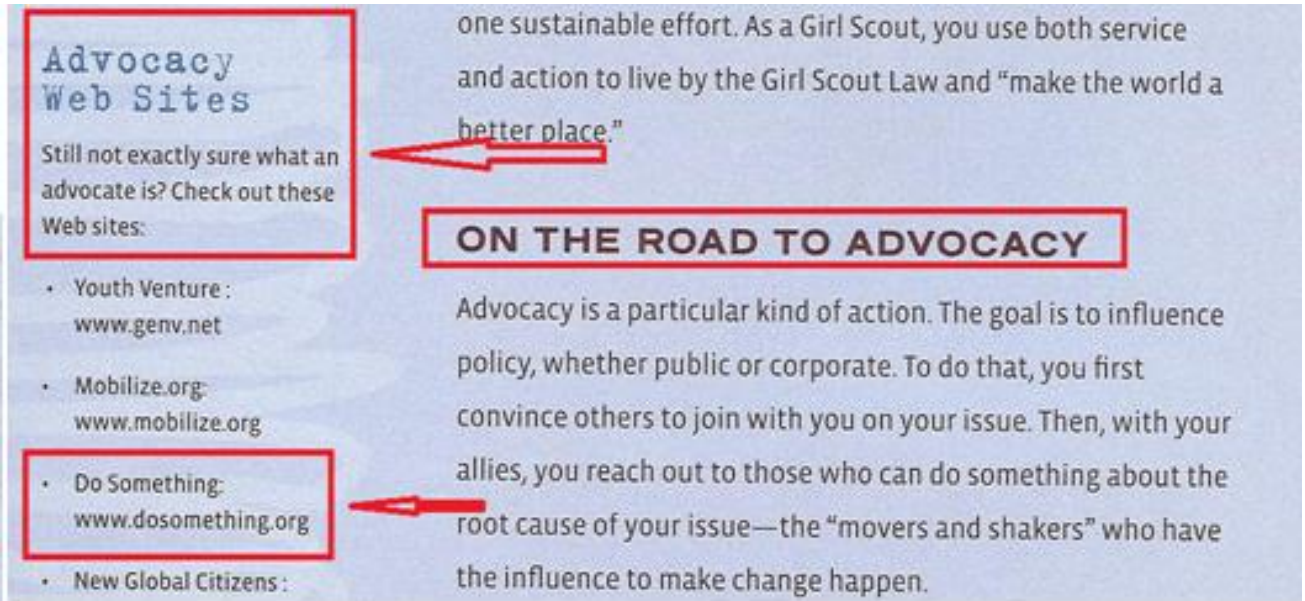


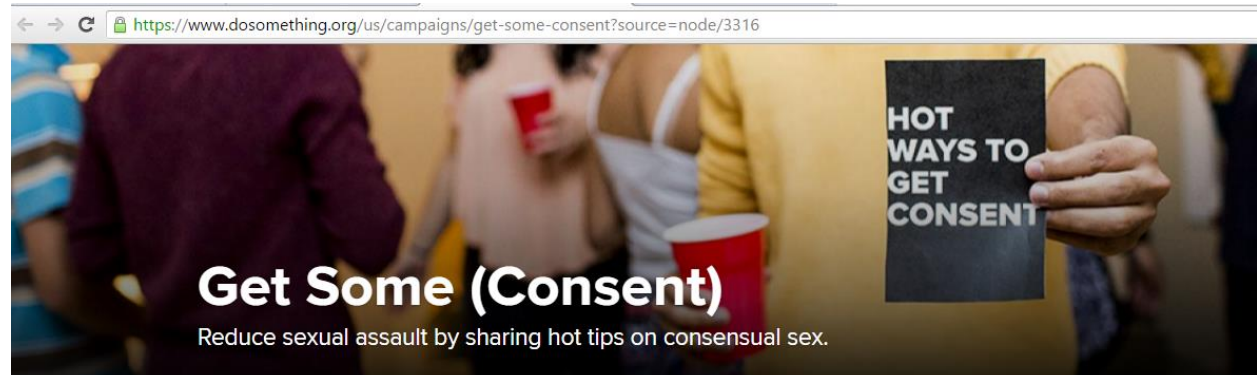

Over on DoSomething.org, girls are linked to campaigns like “Get Some (Consent): reduce sexual assault by sharing hot tips for consensual sex.” This campaign encourages participants to download/distribute a resource entitled “Hot Ways to Get Consent” which includes many vulgar terms including four letter words. Over 40% of young people say they don't verbally express enthusiastic consent before or during sex.^{1,2}

The Solution

Educate your peers about sexual assault prevention by showing them that asking for consent doesn't have to be hella awkward. Bow chicka wow wow.³

Round up your friends and start a Get Some (Consent) Crew. When you head out to parties on campus, print out a handful of our Hot Ways to Get Consent handouts and plant them throughout the party space.

Time and Place

Students are most vulnerable to sexual assault during the "red zone," the first six to eight weeks of the semester from August through October. So plan to hit up lots of parties then (like you needed an excuse).

Samples from recommended Hot Ways to Get Consent Handout below:



Want the best sex of your life? Just ask.

Asking for consent doesn't have to kill the mood. In fact, it's hot. Like, really hot.

Make sure your partner is in a state to give consent -- like, not underage or intoxicated. Then ask for consent and listen for an enthusiastic (potentially whispered or moaned) "yes." If they're not down, just stop. OK, ready? Say these things and thank us later.

- You cool with where with this is going?
- I'm gonna be honest. I really want to have sex with you. You down?
- I really want to _____. You cool with that?
- F*ck pickup lines. Wanna bang?
- Do you like when I do this?
- What do you want me to do with you?
- Would it feel good if I _____?
- Do you want to try _____?
- Do you like it when I _____? Do you want to do it to me?
- Is this okay?
- Does this feel good?
- Can I take off your shirt/top/bra/pants?
- Is there anything you'd like me to do differently?
- Do you like it fast?
- Do you like it slow?
