Tomar acción

1. Identifica un asunto que afecta actualmente a los trabajadores agrícolas y toma acción. Si necesitas ideas, visita uno de los siguientes sitios: www.nfwm.org y haz clic en YAYA (Youth and Young Adult Network); www.ufw.org; o www.doloreshuerta.org; Dependiendo de los asuntos actuales, algunas ideas sobre qué acción tomar incluyen ejercer influencia en los funcionarios elegidos mediante una campaña de correo electrónico, por ejemplo, para pedir que se hagan cumplir las leyes sobre salud y seguridad para los trabajadores agrícolas, o visitar a los funcionarios elegidos de tu localidad o defender la legislación que beneficiará a las familias de trabajadores agrícolas.
2. Hay trabajadores agrícolas que trabajan en muchas partes de Estados Unidos. Investiga qué está sucediendo en la zona donde vives. El sitio del Ministerio Nacional para el Campesino en www.nfwm.org puede ayudarte a identificar asuntos locales que afrontan los trabajadores agrícolas y grupos locales. Si vives en una comunidad agrícola, pregunta a tus familiares y vecinos que trabajan en los campos cuáles son sus preocupaciones. Busca grupos que ya están esforzándose por ayudar a los trabajadores agrícolas, como grupos de iglesias, sindicatos, centros comunitarios, o clubes estudiantiles. Trabaja en un proyecto con un grupo local, o empieza tu propio proyecto. Podría ser una campaña de recolección de alimentos, ropa, etc., o una campaña para tratar de mejorar las viviendas de los trabajadores agrícolas de la localidad.



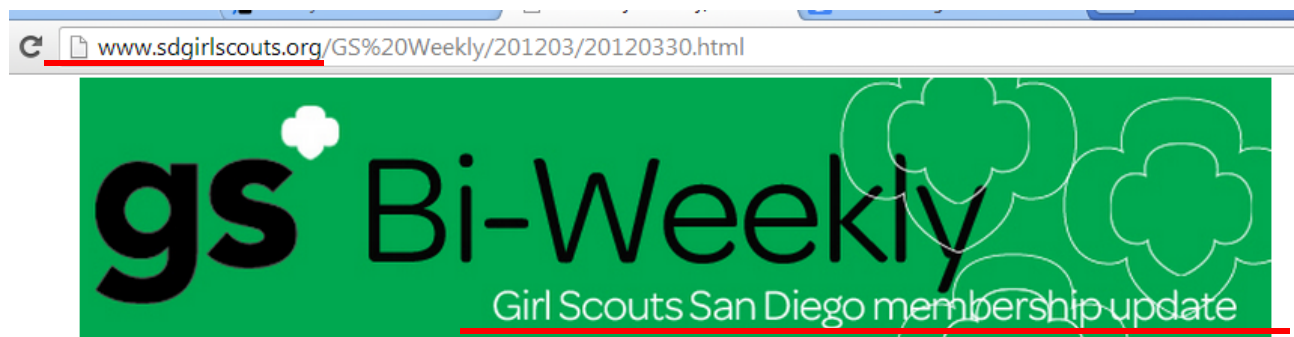
