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WAGGGS at the Global Youth Forum 2012

WAGGGS has been involved as a member of the International Steering Committee (ISC) of the Global Youth Forum since August 2012. Nefeli Themeli, a member of the Greek Guiding Association and a WAGGGS Leadership Development Facilitator and Anush Aghabalyan, WAGGGS Senior Advocacy Coordinator are on the Steering Committee of the GYF.

WAGGGS sits on the ISC Program Taskforce (tasked with finalizing the program and agenda for the GYF and how it functions) and Outcomes and Follow-up Taskforce (tasked with working on the outcome document for the forum and what the follow-up activities/commitments are). WAGGGS has also offered input in the thematic papers that will be delivered in the Forum, stressing the importance of girls and young women which aligns with WAGGGS' mission and vision.
